YEAR IN Review

A Look Back at 2018



St. Luke's announced plans for the next phase of its campus expansion. This exciting project includes the expansion/relocation of our Emergency Department (ED), Cardiac Cath Labs, helistop and other emergency and imaging services to St. Luke's Building A. Beginning in April 2019, this project will more than double the size of our current ED and provide emergency transport with immediate accessibility to critical care services, offering our community improved quality, access and patient experience when in need of emergency care.



St. Luke's Sports & Event Center and St. Luke's Proctor Fitness Center both opened, offering active opportunities for students and community members in and around Proctor.




St. Luke's worked with Northland Healthy Minds to offer Make It OK training and a series of other events to help eliminate the stigma around mental illness in the Northland.

St. Luke's began a new program for amputees that coordinates care between patient, prosthetist, providers and care staff that helps provide ongoing patient-centered care to offer the best quality of life possible for the patient.



St. Luke's Advanced Wound Care & Hyperbaric Center was named Healogics' Wound Care Center of the Year out of the more than 600 wound care centers across the United States. They were also awarded the Healogics' designation of Center of Excellence and the President's Circle award. The Center also celebrated reaching the milestone of healing 1,000 wounds.



Population Health was implemented as one of St. Luke's Strategic Plan's six major priorities. This organization-wide initiative focuses on providing patients the right care and support, at the right time, in the right setting.



St. Luke's partnered with several organizations to create Bridging Health North, a webbased source of population data and community health information that provides planners, policy makers and community members a tool for community assessment, strategic planning and identifying best practices for improvement, collaboration and advocacy.



In June, St. Luke's Regional Cancer Center celebrated the opening of its new linear accelerator, which allows radiation oncologists to treat patients through external beam radiation by delivering high-energy x-rays and electrons directly to a tumor.



St. Luke's Hibbing Family Medical Clinic added Urgent Care services, becoming St. Luke's seventh Urgent Care location.

Re-verified as Level II Trauma Center

St. Luke's Regional Trauma Center was re-verified as a Level II Trauma Center by the Committee on Trauma (COT) of the American College of Surgeons (ACS). This achievement recognizes St. Luke's Regional Trauma Center's commitment to providing optimal care for injured patients.

St. Luke's Laboratory Receives CAP Re-Accreditation

The Accreditation Committee of the College of American Pathologists (CAP) again awarded accreditation to St. Luke's Laboratory, based on results of an on-site inspection as a part of the CAP's Accreditation programs. Accreditation is renewed every two years.

St. Luke's Certified as a DNV GL Healthcare Hip & Knee Replacement Center

The Certification, based on standards set forth by DNV GL Healthcare and considering the guidelines of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, recognizes program excellence in patient care and outcomes. DNV GL Healthcare certification as a Hip & Knee Replacement Center validates St. Luke's excellence across the spectrum of hip and knee replacement care, from diagnosis to treatment, rehabilitation, education and outcomes.



St. Luke's Cardiology Receives Recognition, Awards

St. Luke's earned the distinction of becoming a STEMI or Heart Attack Receiving Center from the American Heart Association's (AHA) Mission: Lifeline STEMI Heart Attack Accreditation program, earning gold level recognitions for being a STEMI and NSTEMI Receiving Center. St. Luke's also earned the American College of Cardiology's NCDR ACTION Registry Platinum Performance Achievement Award.

St. Luke's Cardiovascular Rehab Program Re-certified

St. Luke's Cardiovascular Rehabilitation Program was recertified by the American Association of Cardiovascular and Pulmonary Rehabilitation (AACVPR), recognizing St. Luke's for its commitment to improving quality of life by enhancing standards of care. St. Luke's cardiovascular rehabilitation program includes exercise, education, counseling, and support for patients and their families. AACVPR Program Certification is valid for three years.

St. Luke's Receives NCDR ACTION Registry Award

St. Luke's earned the American College of Cardiology's NCDR ACTION Registry Platinum Performance Achievement Award. St. Luke's is one of only 203 hospitals nationwide to receive the honor, recognizing high standards of patient care. To receive the ACTION Registry Platinum Performance Achievement Award, St. Luke's demonstrated sustained achievement in the ACTION Registry for eight consecutive quarters.
